I. POSTURAL AND GROSS MOTOR DEVELOPMENT

III. BODY PERCEPTION/BODY AWARENESS

- 3 2 1 Dislikes the feeling of certain types of clothing
- 3 2 1 Dislikes being touched unexpectedly or sitting close to someone
- 3 2 1 Needs to work close to others, sitting on lap, "invading space"
- 3 2 1 Tends to pinch, hit, or bite self or others
- 3 2 1 Seems overly sensitive to slight bumps or scrapes

- 3 2 1 Hesitates to climb or play with equipment that moves
- 3 2 1 Has poor awareness of self in space, bumps into things frequently

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IV. <u>AUDITORY/LANGUAGE SKILLS</u>
